SOMMUNITY INTERESTS SURVEY RESULTS

ACIA HAPPENINGS

Several ACIA residents have shared suggestions and ideas with BOT members. Many homeowners commented on the need for monetary fines for continued deed restriction violations. Other homeowners expressed a strong interest in meeting their neighbors and establishing a stronger community base. This survey was created to obtain an even larger amount of community feedback. The BOT appreciates the time and effort taken by community members to share their thoughts.

The survey was given on line through the locked portion of the ACIA Web Site. It was also in the ACIA Happenings newsletter. Surveys were either completed on line, given to CAM, the Management Company or e-mailed to twendtacia@gmail.org. Results were compiled as of 9/2/19. Answers were rounded up to the nearest percentage.

291 people responded out of approximately 2500 ACIA households (11.6%). Not every question on each form was completed. The confidence level of the survey is 90% with the margin of error at 4.5%.

Traffic Enforcement:


