HOT DOG! NATIONAL NIGHT OUT HUGE SUCCESS!

National Night Out (NNO) is an annual community-building campaign that promotes police-community partnerships and neighborhood camaraderie to make our neighborhoods safer, more caring places to live... furthermore, it provides a great opportunity to bring police, fire departments and other emergency responders together under positive circumstances. Unfortunately, this year's event was marred by the senseless death of Harris County Sheriff's Deputy Sandeep Dhaliwal on Friday, September 27. However, many neighborhoods honored his life and accomplishments at their NNO event and showed how our first responders are truly appreciated.

We were again treated to Cy-Fair Fire Department (previously known as Cy-Fair VFD) Station No. 10 Fire Truck #10 and crew that stayed until the very last person had their questions answered. The HOA VOLUNTEERS had to save hot dogs for them because for the first time ever...we actually ran out of hot dogs! Captain Randy and his crew always present an informative and spirited show for us. Since they ate last they even helped us break down the tables and chairs on the patio. The EMTs had to respond to a call and missed the hot dogs. There is always a possibility of the fire truck and/or the EMTs having to answer a call while attending our event. Each year we complete and submit a request for their presence at our event. This form contains a reminder that reads: "Please understand that we are a working fire department. There may be times we cannot attend your scheduled function or have to leave early due to an emergency".

Sheriff's Deputies Woolsey and Leverette (2 of our contract deputies) attended, answering questions from homeowners and children. Also, Sgt.

Willis provided us with a sign and stake for Deputy Dhaliwal which was displayed in front of the clubhouse.

Also, making an appearance was Harris County Precinct 4 Commissioner Jack Cagle and his entourage that included Ben from his office who came bearing gifts of cookies (not once, but twice during the event!) and other goodies. Commissioner Cagle left letters regarding the proposed increase in Harris County taxes which he and Commissioner Steve Radack opposed (see article in this issue).

The HOA again provided the "goodie bags" that are no longer given out by the fire department. They included a plastic fire helmet, Paw Patrol coloring books and crayons, a hand held American flag, Halloween pencil, silver sheriff's star and stickers.

The HOA Board would like to take this opportunity to thank the following "VOLUNTEERS EXTRAORDINARE" for their outstanding contribution of the "gift of time" in helping make this event the success it was. It would not have happened without their help! They helped decorate, cooked and served the hot dogs and Frito pies, and kept the Social Events Coordinator from going nuts! These VOLUNTEERS are "tried and true" and have helped us for years, not only for NNO but also Splash Day and endless other things we ask them to do! NOTICE: FINING POLICY TO BE INSTATED EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2020

Effective January 1, 2020 a Fining Policy will be instated in the Willowbridge and Stonebridge Communities. A Fining Policy is used by an HOA in order to influence or help determine the outcome of the Bylaws and CC&Rs of an association as well as other County, State and Federal Laws and Regulations. Fines empower a Homeowner's Board to carry out its duty to enforce those governing documents and laws. The new Fining Policy will assist in accomplishing the intended course of action of having a safe, comfortable place to live with sustained and improved market values throughout the community. The implementation of a fining policy and procedure will aid the HOA Board and Homeowners in maintaining focus on complying with the HOA Bylaws and CC&Rs.

- 1) So why do HOAs fine? To curb violations
- 2) is an HOA authorized to fine? Yes, through the HOA governing documents
 - 3) What amount should the fine be? **Reasonable and not arbitrary**

In November there will be a mailing to Homeowners of the Fining Policy and explanation of its procedural use. After receipt Homeowners may contact the HOA Board or Graham Management for clarification of any questions regarding the policy.

HARRIS COUNTY PROPERTY TAX HIKE DERAILED

On Tuesday, October 8, Harris County Commissioners Court met to vote on a proposed property tax increase of 8%. County Commissioners R. Jack Cagle (ours-Precinct 4) and Steve Radack (Precinct 3) derailed the vote on the tax increase by skipping the meeting. There are 5 county commissioners and a quirk in the Texas Government Code requires a quorum of 4 to vote, but only 3 were present.

In 2020 there will be a state imposed revenue cap on property taxes as a result of Governor Greg Abbott signing a property tax reform bill in June that limits year-over-year revenue growth for cities and counties to 3.5%, above which requires voter approval. The 8% increase equates to 2.26 cents per \$100 assessed value which would increase taxes by \$37.65 on a home assessed at \$230,000.



THE RECIPE BOX MAKE-AHEAD HOLIDAY TETRAZZINI

From: Kroger

This recipe is a great time saver if you have family visiting and/or use of leftover turkey.

1 pkg. (8 oz.) Kroger cream cheese

12 oz. uncooked linguine

1 t. garlic powder

1 T. olive oil

½ t. Kroger Italian Seasoning

8 oz. fresh mushrooms, sliced

1/4 t. each: salt & black pepper

1 c. onion, chopped

2/3 c. milk

½ c. chicken broth

3 c. cooked turkey, chicken, ham or combo, cubed

1 ½ c. frozen peas, thawed

1 ½ c. Parmesan cheese, divided

- 1. Combine cream cheese, garlic powder, Italian seasoning, salt, pepper, milk and chicken broth in a large bowl, set aside.
- 2. Cook linguine according to package directions to al dente.
- 3. Heat olive oil in a large skillet over medium high heat. Add mushrooms and onions; sauté 6 minutes or until onions are softened and mushrooms have released their liquid. Add 2 cups of reserved cream cheese mixture; stir to combine.
- 4. Add cooked linguine, cubed meat and thawed peas to cream cheese mixture.
- 5. Add $\frac{3}{4}$ cup Parmesan cheese and stir to combine. Transfer to a 9" x 13" baking dish that has been lightly coated with cooking spray. Top with remaining Parmesan cheese.
- 6. Bake immediately @ 350 degrees for approximately 35 minutes or cover and refrigerate up to 8 hours.
- 7. If refrigerated: let stand at room temperature for 30 minutes. Bake, covered, 30 minutes or until bubbling.
- 8. Refrigerate leftovers.

GUN SAFETY TIPS

Harris County Precinct 4 Constable Mark Herman would like to remind gun owners about the importance of firearm safety, especially when there are children in the home. It is the gun owner's responsibility to keep their firearms safely stored and in a location where they are out of the reach of small children. Knowing and practicing gun safety is not only crucial in preventing injuries and the tragic loss of a love one; it is the law!

We urge parents to follow these simple gun safety rules:

- 1. Always store guns in a locked location, unloaded, out of the reach and sight of children.
- 2. Always store ammunition in a separate locked location, out of the reach and sight of children.
 - 3. Keep the keys and combination hidden.
- 4. When a gun is not in its lockbox, keep it in your line of sight.
- 5. Make sure all guns are equipped with effective, child-resistant gun locks.
- 6. If a visitor has a gun in a backpack, briefcase, handbag or an unlocked car, provide them with a locked place to hold it while they are in your home.
- 7. Leaving guns on a nightstand, table, or other place where a child can gain access may lead to injuries and fatalities.
- 8. Explain to your children how a gun that they might see on television or a video game is different from a gun in real life. "A gun in real life, can really hurt people."
- 9. Teach your children to never touch a gun and immediately tell an adult if they see one.
- 10. Talk to grandparents and parents of the friends that your children visit about gun safety storage practices.




