Greener Grass with Less Water

Did you know that the average household, nationally, spends 50 percent of their water usage on outdoor irrigation? During the winter, most of us in Central Texas do not need to water our lawns on a routine basis, but to keep grass green through the rest of the year, careful planning can help residents use water wisely, cutting down on water waste and lowering water bills.

National studies have shown that homes with automatic sprinkler systems, on average, use 35 percent more water than homes without installed irrigation systems. "We've seen locally that customers who have an in-ground irrigation system spend up to 80 percent of their water use outdoors," said Earl Foster, General Manager for Lakeway MUD (LMUD), a local water provider. The majority of this usage is just wasted water.

To help counteract excess watering, most water providers implement watering restrictions in their district. In Lakeway, customers of LMUD have been limited to a two-day-per-week watering schedule, yearround, since last summer. At the January 8, 2020 Board of Directors meeting for LMUD, the Board approved a new irrigation schedule that maintains the two-day-per-week restriction, but further separates the days by the last digit of the residential address, rather than just even or odd. "The purpose for this change," said Foster, "is to help us minimize the spikes in water usage we have seen each week, which puts strain our water processing plant."

"Right now, our peak spikes in usage are on Wednesdays and

Saturdays," said Raf Mendoza, Water Supervisor for LMUD. "These spikes put a strain on our normal operation capacity: our elevated storage tanks are brought down to low levels and the plants are running non-stop for 30 hours at a time." Mendoza can attribute these spikes to outdoor use based on seasonal usage. "During the summer, our plant productions average 5 million gallons, whereas in winter, we go down to 1 to 2 million," he said.

"If customers can follow this new schedule, we will be able to maintain higher levels of stored water in our water towers, which customers will appreciate with seeing better consistency in their water pressure," Foster said. "But, beyond following the new schedule, we encourage customers to have their irrigation system checked each fall or winter to make sure it is running as efficiently as possible before the weather gets hot."

An irrigation system evaluation should include checking for leaks, sprinkler heads for efficiency, and the control panel for proper scheduling. Residents who receive water from a list of Lower Colorado River Authority (LCRA) water customers, including from LMUD, have the option to apply for the WaterSmart Rebates Program through LCRA. This program can help offset the cost of services and equipment to save water and money. Additionally, Lakeway residents can utilize the Water My Yard program which uses local weather data to provide recommendations on how to run irrigation systems efficiently. Angela Frankhouser named Rough Hollow Elementary principal



(Lakeway, TX) – Angela Frankhouser, currently serving as principal of Lake Travis Elementary School, has been named principal of Rough Hollow Elementary School, Lake Travis ISD Superintendent Dr. Brad Lancaster announced January 6.

"Mrs. Frankhouser will officially begin her tenure as principal of Rough Hollow Elementary on Tuesday, January 21," said Dr. Lancaster. "As she begins her transition and prepares for

the opening of Rough Hollow Elementary in August, Mrs. Frankhouser will be working temporarily from the LTISD Administration Building. In her absence, I have appointed Mary Patterson to serve as interim principal at Lake Travis Elementary School for the remainder of the school year. Ms. Patterson is an accomplished school administrator who most recently served as interim assistant principal at West Cypress Hills Elementary School last spring. Senior staff and I will work with our Human Resources Department to post the Lake Travis Elementary principal position in February. In the interim, please join me in congratulating Mrs. Frankhouser on her new position."

Mrs. Frankhouser possesses nearly 25 years of wide-ranging experience and success in public education, having served in various classroom and administrative roles. She began her career as a science teacher at the Austin Independent School District. In 2006, the Lubbock native joined Lake Travis High School where she taught biology and chemistry and also served as a TAKS Specialist before being promoted to assistant principal. Mrs. Frankhouser then served two years as assistant principal at Lake Travis Elementary School before being promoted to principal, a position she has held since 2013. She earned a Bachelor's degree in Science from the University of Texas and a Master's degree in Educational Administration from Concordia University. Mrs. Frankhouser and her husband, Jason, have two children—Jake and Ace, both of whom attend Lake Travis High School.

Located in the Rough Hollow community, Rough Hollow Elementary School was designed by Pfluger Architects and is being built by Bartlett Cocke General Contractors. The \$33 million facility will encompass more than 102,000 square feet and will



have the capacity to house 850 students. Special features include a high-efficient, Energy Star building envelope that makes use of geothermal wells that will conserve operating costs for heating and cooling; a Main Distribution Frame room with windows to the corridor to create student interest in the building's network system; a full-size basketball court inside the gym with cushioned vinyl flooring; outdoor learning and story areas at the library's exterior; outdoor dining areas adjacent to playscapes, play fields and basketball courts; and storm water drainage directed to bioretention basins that support site landscaping. The project is part of the district's \$253 million bond program approved by voters in November 2017.


Art Exhibition Showcases Work From Lake Travis Elementary Students

The Secrets We Kept by Lara Prescott Popular cultural education program features bestselling author



Now entering its thirteenth year, LAKE TRAVIS READS 2020 will feature the new book by acclaimed Austin author Lara Prescott, The Secrets We Kept, which became an instant New York Times Bestseller and was selected by Reese Witherspoon for her Hello Sunshine book club.

At the height of the Cold War, two secretaries are pulled out of the typing pool

at the CIA and given the assignment of a lifetime. Their mission: to smuggle Doctor Zhivago out of the USSR, where no one dared publish it, and help Pasternak\'s magnum opus make its way into print around the world. Glamorous and sophisticated Sally Forrester is a seasoned spy who has honed her gift for deceit all over the world--using her magnetism and charm to pry secrets out of powerful men. Irina is a complete novice, and under Sally\'s tutelage quickly learns how to blend in, make drops, and invisibly ferry classified documents.

The Secrets We Kept combines a legendary literary love story--the decades-long affair between Pasternak and his mistress and muse, Olga Ivinskaya, who was sent to the Gulag and inspired Zhivago\'s heroine, Lara--with a narrative about two women empowered to lead lives of extraordinary intrigue and risk. From Pasternak\'s country estate outside Moscow to the brutalities of the Gulag, from Washington, D.C. to Paris and Milan, The Secrets We Kept captures a watershed moment in the history of literature--told with soaring emotional intensity and captivating historical detail. And at the center of this unforgettable debut is the powerful belief that a piece of art can change the world.

Lara Prescott received her MFA from the Michener Center for Writers at the University of Texas, Austin. She was previously an animal protection advocate and a political campaign operative. Her stories have appeared in The Southern Review, The Hudson Review, Crazyhorse, Day One, and Tin House Flash Fridays. She won the 2016 Crazyhorse Fiction Prize for the first chapter of The Secrets We Kept. She lives in Austin.
