
of this sign-up has been set for 3/23/2021. Tasks will be posted as needed.



## Create Your Own Monarch Butterfly Nursery

Ten years ago my daughter gave me a milkweed plant. She had purchased several plants from a nursery and started to raise Monarch Butterfly caterpillars for her children as a school project and thought I would enjoy it too. I have always loved butterflies and read that Monarchs were becoming endangered so I wanted to help. I have been raising Monarch Butterflies for ten years now and have enjoyed every minute of it.

Once the milkweed begins to flower, butterflies start to lay their eggs on the leaves. The tiny caterpillars emerge and eat their egg shell after 7 days. They are very tiny and difficult to spot. After several days they are 1/4" in length and will eat leaves all day and night. They grow very quickly! Once the caterpillars are approximately 2-2 1/2" in length they will start searching for a spot to make their chrysalis. They will hang upside down for about a day and then start wiggling and secreting a greenish substance around its body. The shell will harden and you will notice a gold thread around the top. After 10 days the chrysalis will appear black, but it is really clear and what you're actually seeing is the butterfly's black body. They will slowly emerge from the bottom of their chrysalis and their wings will be crumpled and damp. The new butterfly will open its wings slowly and pump them until they dry. This can take up to an hour. Don't touch the butterfly during this time or you could damage their fragile wings.

Seed pods will form on the milkweed plants after the flowers are spent. They look like pea pods, but the seeds look like dandelion seeds and blow off. They can be collected and replanted. If you cover or bring the plants inside during the cold weather months they will survive the winter. Just remember to water them. Milkweed is the only thing Monarch caterpillars eat, so please don't spray any herbicides on or around it.
