New Northeast Middle School in Mueller

Thanks to the 2017 Austin Independent School District's (AISD) bond and Austinites voting in favor, there will be a new middle school in Mueller at the corner of Tilley and Zach Scott, just in time for the 2022 school year.

The new middle school will provide a facility to the Northeast Austin neighborhoods, with a planned capacity of 800 to meet the needs of the community. A team of parents, community members, teachers, and others has been meeting regularly since September 2019 as a Campus Architectural Team to help guide the planning process for the campus.

With a design theme inspired by the site's former airport use and built with sustainable processes and guidelines, the school will provide both indoor and outdoor learning opportunities for students. The campus will follow the AISD vision of creating 21st-century learning spaces for students, incorporating flexible spaces allowing for collaborative, interdisciplinary, and project-driven learning.



New Northeast Middle School

The building will accommodate some public use with minimal after-hours staffing as well. Construction is expected to begin in Fall 2020, and anticipated to open in Fall 2022. School attendance boundaries will not be decided until closer to the opening of the school and bus routes are finalized about two weeks prior to the start of the school year.

Mueller Commission Update

Catellus presented information on the Mueller Control Tower block at September's Mueller Commission meeting, though no developer has yet signed on to do the project. Commercial uses will face Berkman Drive and the Tower plaza, with the rest of the block occupied with apartments, sliced by a "paseo" view corridor from the Tower to the corner of Vaughan & Sorin Streets and beyond John Gaines Park. It's still unlikely the public will be able to enter the Tower, partly due to the enormous cost of its renovation. However, efforts continue to explore strategies, such as guided tours, that might allow some accessibility exemptions.

The Art In Public Places panel met on September 14th and approved AKIRASH's metal "chair" sculptures that were presented to the Mueller Neighborhood Association in the past. The 51st Street Mobility Project should start construction in the spring of 2021 and take about eighteen months to complete. The six sculptures – each slightly different and spaced strategically, with four on the south side and two on the north side of E. 51st Street between Berkman and Cameron – will be installed near the end of the project.

The City's Transportation Department has new measures operational October 1 affecting public, on-street metered parking downtown and at Mueller. When parking at metered spots, you no longer need to secure a sticker to the windshield, but instead enter your vehicle's license plate number at the pay station. The first two hours remain at \$2/hour; subsequent hours gradually increase in price to encourage parking turnover, though paid time limits are extended to up to ten hours. Also, a processing fee of \$0.25 for credit card use at a pay station is being added.

Round 1, Lower Body, 4 Minutes:

Minute 1 - Right side single leg step up 40 seconds / Squat hops 20 seconds

Minute 2 - Left side single leg step up 40 seconds / Squat hops 20 seconds

Minute 3 - Right side split squat 40 seconds / Squat hops 20 seconds

Minute 4 - Left side split squat 40 seconds / Squat hops 20 seconds



Squat Hops

Round 2, Upper Body and Abs, 4 Minutes:

Minute 1 - Right side plank crunch 40 seconds / Mountain climbers 20 seconds

Minute 2 - Left side plank crunch 40 seconds / Mountain climbers 20 seconds

Minute 3 - Incline or decline pushups 40 seconds / Mountain climbers 20 seconds

Minute 4 - Tricep dips 40 seconds / Mountain climbers 20 seconds



Mountain Climbers


Round 3, Mobility, 4 Minutes:

Minute 1 - Right side lateral lunge 40 seconds / High knees 20 seconds

Minute 2 - Left side lateral lunge 40 seconds / High knees 20 seconds

Minute 3 - Walking lunges 40 seconds / High knees 20 seconds

Minute 4 - Stair climb 40 seconds / High knees 20 seconds




